

Subject: Changes to ENERGY STAR Power Allowances for Displays Version 6.0



Dear ENERGY STAR Displays Stakeholder,

In light of comments received on the Final Draft Version 6.0 ENERGY STAR Displays specification and test method, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is making a change to the power allowance for models with very high pixel density and the power allowance for large models that meet the definition of enhanced performance displays. EPA is also removing a testing requirement for models with Automatic Brightness Control (ABC). The Department of Energy (DOE) provides additional clarification for how products with network connectivity should be tested.
